The 5* Vieux Castillon is nestled close to the Pont du Gard aqueduct, at the gateway to the Alpilles, and provides a unique, magical and truly poetic setting for a perfectly charming stay.

Locating on the medieval streets of the picturesque village of Castillon-du-Gard, this charming hotel consists of a series of Renaissance buildings that provide the perfect opportunity to enjoy a rare moment of privacy. Time really does seem to stand still behind its thick, ancient stone walls, allowing visitors to experience a truly magical break away from it all amid lush natural surroundings where you're guaranteed a warm welcome. Nowhere is the light as soulful as it is here. The rich, magical palette of colours, flavours and fragrances of Provence are indicative of the genuine authenticity of this region.

Under the watchful eye of the surrounding cypress and olive trees, Le Vieux Castillon will transport you to an extraordinary new world where every detail is designed to ensure your complete well-being with the utmost discretion.

SPOTLIGHT ON A HAMLET BUILT IN STONE

Once over the threshold, discover a labyrinth linking 18 carefully renovated, interconnected medieval houses. This secret kingdom contains walkways, staircases and hidden lounges. It is hard to believe that the hotel offers more than 34 vast guest rooms, some on two levels, with private terraces and views over the tiled rooftops.



THE SIMPLICITY OF LUXURY

After a year of renovation, this place's spirit and character radiate once more from the exposed stonework. More than just part of the décor, it is the source of an all-encompassing, captivating atmosphere which is calming or festive according to the time of day or night. From the lobby to the private terraces, a monastic ambience enhances the shadows and beams of sunlight. Just enough to let the warmth of the south express its full potential.

In Le Vieux Castillon's thirty-four guest rooms, bedside tables, bookshelves and bathroom fittings have been designed with clean and simple lines. Curtains and blinds, bed linen and bath towels come in an all-enveloping palette of milky, chalky and vanilla whites. Recliners on balconies and rooftops, deep sofas and all-new

beds offer an enticing invitation to relax and while away the hours. The muted atmosphere of the Deluxe guest rooms offers a haven when the sun starts to shine too fiercely.

The 37 to 46 m² Junior Suites on two levels have been entirely redesigned to facilitate the passage between sleeping, bathroom, living and outdoor areas. Each one offers superb glimpses of alleyways, stone gargoyles nestling under Génoise roof tiles, patios and blue skies.

Like a holiday home, it's a place to spend time, not just to sleep.

AZUR, A SUN-SOAKED CUISINE MADE FOR SHARING

Le Vieux Castillon invite guests to discover a new culinary experience beside the swimming pool. Set in an idyllic, sun-drenched setting, the new AZUR restaurant offers a convivial, flavourful and authentic approach to dining, centred on the pleasure of sharing. The menu features generous dishes designed to be enjoyed together: pita bread with aubergine and stracciatella, Camargue oysters, sea bass ceviche, a truffled croque, among other seasonal delights.

A plancha completes the experience, providing the perfect opportunity to savour delicately grilled dishes infused with subtle aromas. Conceived for moments of togetherness under the Provençal sun, AZUR welcomes guests in an intimate 30-seat setting, ensuring a warm and relaxed atmosphere, ideal for gathering with friends or family.



LA TABLE DU CASTILLON

The hotel's restaurant has been refurbished to feature bright, minimalist, contemporary decor that nevertheless maintains the charm of the Renaissance building in which it is housed, making it the perfect place to sample the culinary delights prepared by our chef.

The minimalist and symmetrical furniture in the dining room was selected to suit the tastes of interior designer Natalia Megret, whilst the About A Chair armchairs by HAY, with their white seats and wooden bases, complement the room perfectly.

The discreet horizontal fireplace with its glass walls brings a touch of warmth and style to the room, where limestone features once again

around the doors and on the floor.

Guests here can enjoy dining overlooking the pool as the sunlight streams in through the large picture window, whilst Natalia Megret has had a series of Lanterna suspended lights designed by Sam Baron for Petite Friture installed to create a cluster effect, resulting in a lighting centrepiece that looks perfectly at home here in the restaurant.

You might, should the mood take you, choose to dine alfresco on the delightful terrace, in the shade of the Occitan stonework, from where you will be able to see the swimming pool overlooking the Alpilles.



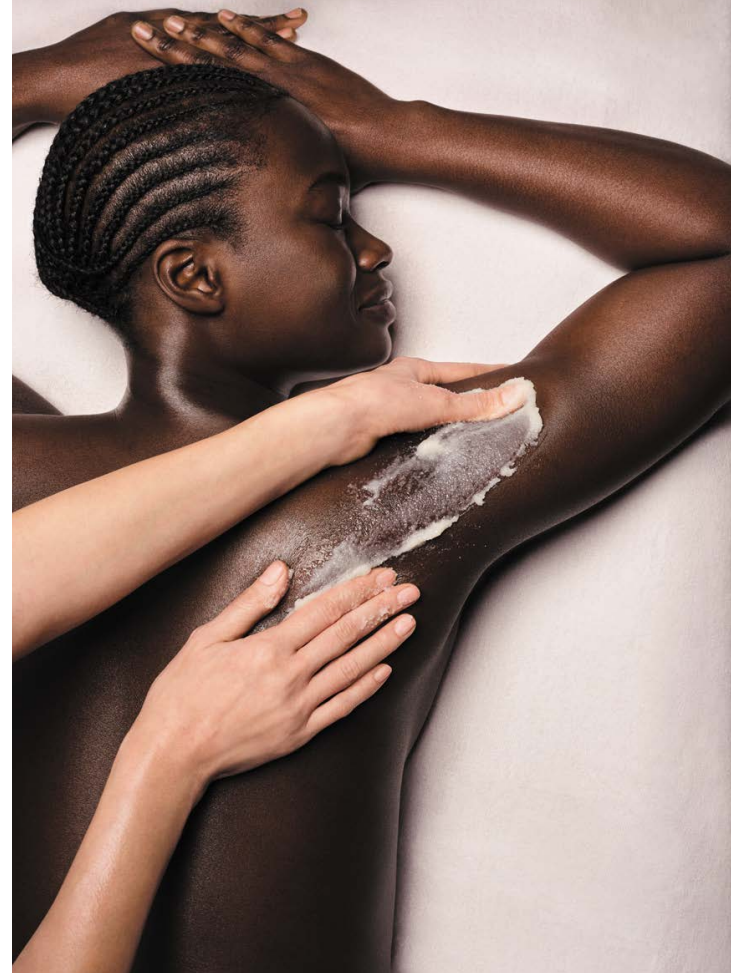


JOIO

ACCESS

By car :

From Paris, Marseille, or Montpellier: A9 (5 km from the hotel), exit Remoulins. From Remoulins, take the N86 towards Montélimar. At “Les Croisées,” follow the D19A towards Alès, then turn right onto D228 to Castillon.

By train :

Avignon TGV (30 km), Nîmes (30 km).

By plane :

Nîmes Airport (30 km), Montpellier Airport (70 km), Marseille–Marignane Airport (108 km).





A YEARNING FOR NATURE

With the Alpilles regional nature park on one side and the Camargue nature reserve on the other, the Pays d'Uzège has preserved its unspoilt environment. It can be seen from a charming belvedere in the medieval village of Castillon du Gard which offers a panoramic viewpoint.

Within the village walls, houses built entirely with stone from the local quarries of Vers, Pont du Gard and Castillon cluster together on the promontory.

Once through the arched gateways, explore the cobblestone streets keeping your eyes open for interesting gargoyles. The Maison des Remparts and the 18th century Château de Belle Vue have been stylishly restored.



The GR 63 trail leaving from Castillon du Gard leads to the Pont du Gard via a two-hour circuit which retraces the remains of the aqueduct and follows the Mémoire de Garrigue footpath.

You can discover the caves, chasms and clear waters of the Gorges du Gardon, leading to the Cévennes mountains, by canoe or by following the hiking trail. Don't miss the Sautadet waterfall at Roque-sur-Cèze on the road to Bagnols.

Located at the crossroads of Provence and Languedoc, between Nîmes, Avignon, and Arles, the Gard is a land steeped in sunshine and history.

INTO THE WILD

The first traces of human activity in Uzès are to be found on the banks of the River Alzon, near the Fontaine d'Eure springs. The Romans benefited from an abundant water supply here. It was transported to Nîmes over a 50 kilometre aqueduct, of which the Pont du Gard is the most remarkable portion. Leaving from the Cathedral in Uzès town centre, a trail takes you through the surrounding countryside with its drystone shelters (capitelles) via the Fontaine d'Eure next to the River Alzon, to the Pont du Gard which once carried water from Uzès to Nîmes.

GOING TO MARKET

Although one of the region's most famous markets is held in Place aux Herbes in the centre of Uzès twice a week, cycle rides in the area offer countless other opportunities to enjoy delicious local produce such as picholine olive oil, semi-white semi-purple asparagus and the famous black truffle.

TO DISCOVER

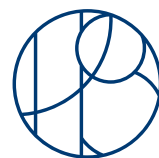
The Atelier du Café in Uzès, Gaiffier the greengrocer (an institution), the Pressoir and its delicious fruit concoctions, the apricot and cherry orchards at Collias and asparagus at Saint-Siffret, the Côte-du-Rhône wine rail, the Duché d'Uzès, Côteaux du Gard and Côteaux du Languedoc appellations, the Uzès truffle farms and olive oils from the Moulin d'Uzès.

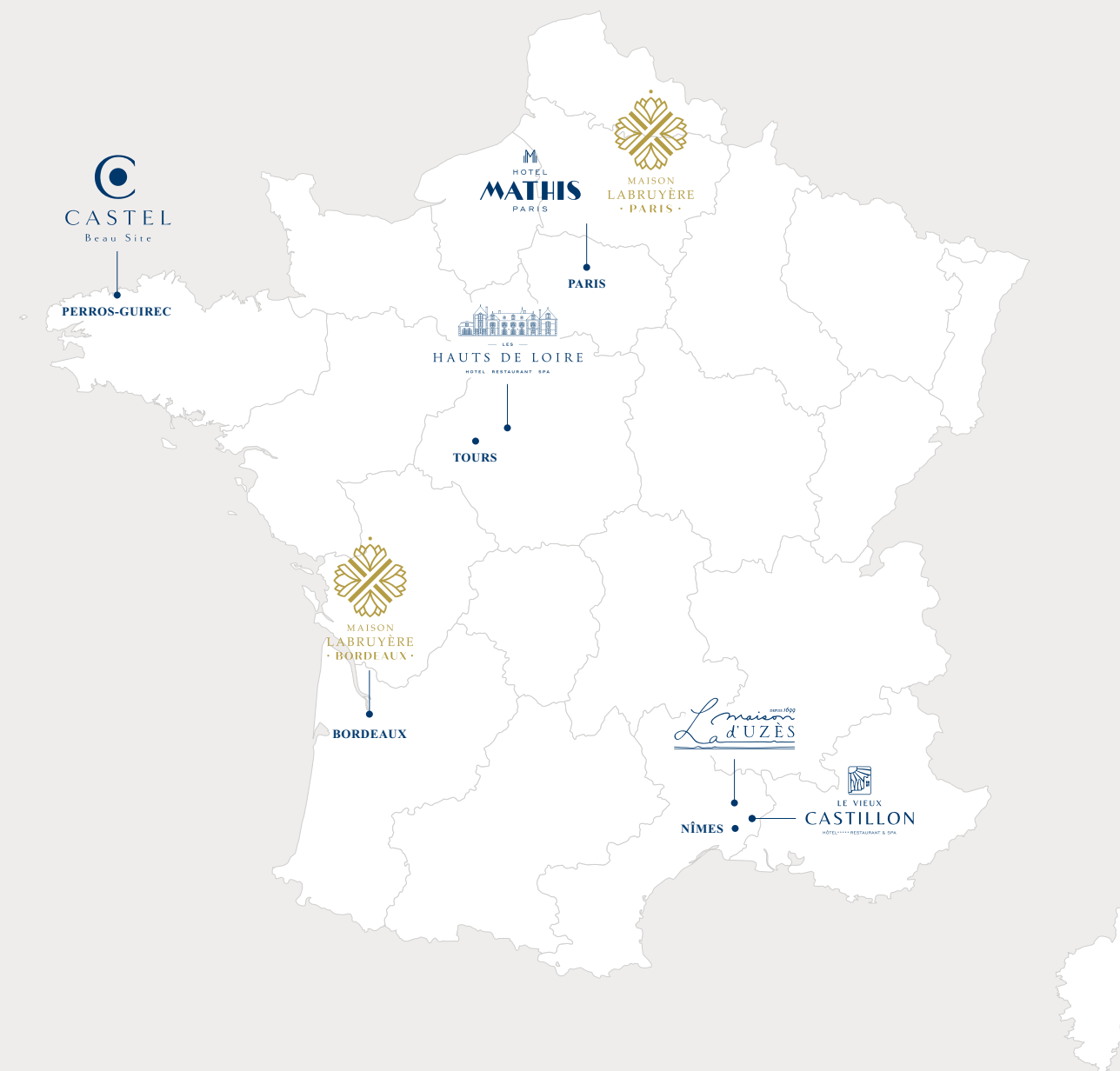

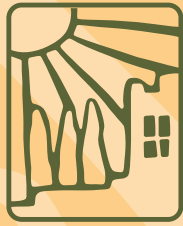
